- To ensure that the survice can reach the society and spread humanity through education, research social, cultural & sports activities


THE PRACTICES:

participated in swatch Bharath mission, clean and green programs in near by villages and distributed jute bags in public areas for promotion of environment friendly.


For knowing the importance of uses of water our students conducted water week day on occasion of JalShakthiAbhiyan.




There is essential need to inspire those around them to volunteer in the community and to mobilize students. With much work, our staff and NSS program officer have fully resolved the issue and accomplished more

Best Practice –II

<u>Title of the Practice</u>: Improvement in slow learners.

Objectives:


- 1. To enhance visual aids to teach the concepts for better understanding.
- 2. Allowing the Mentor program to look after every student for their improvement in studies.
- 3. Conducting weekly tests on weekly topics and study hours.
- 4. In order to develop self-confidence in certain students, we allot certain simple topics to give seminars.



- 5. Conducting different competitions and extracurricular activities to improve their knowledge.
- 6. Demonstrations are given in simple format for understanding.

The Practice:

Every faculty member is encouraged by the college to use visual teaching tools such as charts, graphs, and diagrams to help slow learners. Additionally, a specific mentor is assigned to a group of students in order to help them understand the material. Mentors look after them from their first year until the end of their course. Every week, a specific topic is assigned for tests, which are evaluated and used to help students perform better on final exams. Included study time in the schedule and was overseen by the faculty that the principal had assigned. Selective students should be given topics that are not difficult, and encouraging them to give oral or PowerPoint presentations to boost their confidence should also allow every student to freely consult with faculty members to get clarification on the concepts. Faculty are monitoring students who have fallen short on internal exams and have backlogs from previous semesters. They are constantly giving them advice on how to raise their grades and finish their earlier. Organizing various contests and encouraging everyone to take part in a discussion of the concepts in a group setting. Live examples are provided during instruction to engage students and encourage enthusiastic learning of the concepts.



Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

Students do not regularly attend classes and do not show any interest in taking part in concept-related group discussions. Some students who struggle academically and who have previously neglected to turn in assignments and weekly tests that have been assigned by concerned faculty. Only a few parents did not care about their children's education and did not force them to go to class regularly. Every staff member struggle to motivate students who were compelled to take the course and are uninterested. Parents must assist in encouraging their children to attend college regularly and to take their exams without missing a beat.
